Areas of intervention:



Guinea Conakry and Forrest Region (Gueckedou, Macenta, Dabola and Kissidougou)

Liberia – Lofa County (North / North East - border with Guinea

Sierra Leone – Kambia and Bombali district (border with Guinea and Liberia)



Internal security measures:

- Limit any grouping of peoples or staff in front of the PU premise
- Disinfection of Plan offices, vehicles, staff residences by the Red Cross.
- Carry on complete disinfection of the PU vehicles and premise and iinstallation of hand washing facilities and disinfectant doormats at the entrance of each Plan office
- Sanitizer gel available for each staff and in all vehicles of Plan
- Restriction on international travel
- Daily Senior meetings to monitor any development and to decide and implement appropriate line of action
- List all people who came into contact with patients / dead *
- Suspension of community visits by Plan agents and field partners*
- Guéckédou Unit Program Office Closure*



Plan response:

- Active role in the coordination response group at national and local level
- Design and implementation of national communication plan on Ebola (i.e. Breaking the transmission Campaign in Liberia)
- Community meetings and media broadcasting on: mode of transmission of Ebola virus, how to manage Ebola cases, prevention, community surveillance.
- Dissemination of information through standardized messages, brochures,
 posters, sms, IEC kits (all translated in local languages)
- School awareness and trainings on hygiene practices and provision of washing systems in schools



- Training of community health workers and clinical staff.
- Organise Plan community volunteers on reporting of any identified suspected case
- Management of volunteers for the disinfection of public places and suspected cases homes
- Provision of fuel and gasoline for vehicles for government health teams and medical supplies & disinfectants for health centre
- Support the government to surveillance (conduct active case search, contact tracing and follow up in all borders with specific reference to international border districts).
