Why Women Mediators?


- UN Security Council Resolution 1325
- Emphasis on women's participation in peace processes
- Only recently attention paid to women as mediators and how they contributed to the overall landscape of peace and security.

The Northern Ireland Experience

Story of NIWC well known



- Possible because of existence of grass roots women's movement
- In addition, strong presence of peacebuilding, civic mediation work



"Soft Ways of Doing Hard Things"

What do women mediators bring to piplomacy?

1. Relational Approaches:

- Listening/Empathy
- More attuned to emotion or unspoken words
- Prioritising listening to build trust

2. Non -political (?)

- Seen as non-threatening
- Not a competitor/not being 'fit' into the male pecking order
- Soft authority

3. Quietness as a strategic tool

- 'I always hear two or three war stories quietly in the corner'
- "I learned how to sidle up to those difficult conversations in a gentler way"
- "I never wanted to be a big presence. I wanted to be a quiet presence"

4: Experience based knowledge

- engaging culturally sensitive and context specific knowledge
- Sensitivity to traditional gender roles
