Background

- Dochas HIV Working Group, subgroup of Dochas
- Currently 51 members
- Working Group established in 2001
- First Strategic Plan in 2003
- Two objectives: 1) share learning 2) advocacy
- 3 studies: 2002, 2007, 2012

Purpose of the study

 To develop a full understanding of its members practices in relation to HIV and AIDS including trends in expenditure, projects and partnerships


Methodology

- Cross-sectional study
 - 'Audit form' containing information on:
 - Geographical focus
 - Nr and type of projects and activities
 - Target groups
 - Budgets
 - Partnerships
 - Timeframe
 - Integrated programming
 - Learning and evaluation practices

Sample size

- 13 organizations participated in 2012
- 10 organizations participated in 2007
- 6 organizations participated in both studies


Geographic spread of projects: 2007 and 2012




2007: Total of 209 projects implemented

2012: Total of 77 projects implemented

Regional expenditure: 2012 and 2007






2012: Southern Africa 42%, East Africa 27%, South Asia 24%

2007: East Africa 31%, Southern Africa 27%, Central Africa15%

Financial spend in top 3 regions

- Southern Africa
 - 2007: €4.3m → 2012: €3m
- East Africa
 - 2007: €5m → 2012: €1.8m
- South Asia
 - 2007: €1.3m → 2012: €1.7m

Total spend: 2007 and 2012



All agencies:

2012: €7.2m

2007: €16.2m

56% decrease

6 agencies participating in both studies:

2012: €5.8

48% decrease

Irish Aid funding contribution

- All agencies:
 - 2007: 50% 2012: 44%
- 6 agencies participating in both studies:
 - 2007: 51% **—** 2012: 42%

Conclusions and recommendations

- Work concentrated in most affected regions and with local/AIDS/faith based organizations
- Move towards more integrated work and longer term projects
- Decrease in expenditure, number of projects and partnerships
- Need to reverse the trend of decreasing investments in HIV and AIDS interventions
