




Accountability

- No concensus within literature how to define it
- Oxfam: "Accountability is the process through which an organisation balances the needs of stakeholders in its decision-making and activities, and delivers against this commitment.
 - Transparency
 - Participation
 - Learning and Evaluation
 - Feedback
- Allows organisation to give account to, take account of, and be held to account by stakeholders"5

Types of Accountability

- Upward
- Horizontal
- Internal
- Social





Concerns

- 1. Power Shift to Donors
- 2. Reflect Donor Agenda and Concerns
- 3. Ignore Field Context and Culture
- 4. Financial and Time Burdens
- 5. Quantitative vs. Qualititive
- Collecting Genuine Data that Reflects Actual Outcomes



Case Studies

- Ethiopia: Failed to prioritise staff and beneficiaries⁷
- Oxfam Novib: Neglected program goals and lost sight of social accountability¹
- Bright Star: Failed to include staff and decreased effectiveness³
- Mexico: Zapitista Movement⁶
- BRAC and Grameen Bank: Failed to be transparent with accountability⁴

Adaptation Mechanisms

- Effectiveness versus Efficiency
- Empowering Field Offices and Staff
- Incorporating Beneficiary and Local Input
- Investing in Mechanisms for Monitoring, Evaluating, and Learning
- Failing Fast and Adapting
- NGO Support Organisations



Conclusions

- No evidence that results frameworks lead to increased impact and accountability, towards the poor
- Upward Accountability > Social Accountability
- Accountability frameworks provide an opportunity to increase efficiency and transparency, strengthen staff, increase outcomes and change lives.
